Local foundation to present lecture series

Des Moines, Iowa – The Iowa Architectural Foundation will present the 2010 Architecture Month Lecture Series every Tuesday evening throughout April at various locations through the Des Moines metropolitan area. All lectures will begin at 7:00 pm with free admission.

The 2010 series begins on April 6 with “What *Does* Green Mean?” at the Ankeny Arts Center. The speaker is Tom Wollan with Frevert-Ramsey-Kobes Architect-Engineers.

On April 13, attendees will discuss “Renovation as a Green Building Solution” at the newly renovated offices of the American Institute of Architects – Iowa Chapter in Suite 100 at Capital Square (400 Locust Street) in downtown Des Moines. The speaker is project architect Thomas Wright.

“How Historic Buildings are Green” is the topic of the April 20 lecture. The location will be the historic Flynn Mansion on the grounds of Living History Farms in Urbandale. The moderator is Paula Mohr of the State Historic Preservation Office with colleague Jack Porter and Scotney Fenton with RDG Planning & Design.

To conclude the series, “Green Design in New Construction” will be held on April 27 at the Altoona Public Library. The speaker will be John Karrmann with FEH Associates.
