
Mid-Century Modern Home Tour

In June 2023, IAF docents once again welcomed over 200 attendees to this annual favorite of midmod afficionatos. IAF and Iowa Mid-Century Modern offered an exclusive look at the interiors and exteriors of four residences built between 1952 and 1970. Each of the homes showcased the iconic lines and materials of midcentury architecture, including one Linden Heights residence with a rounded glass skylight that encircles its attic chimney. One of the homes, completed in 1954, was designed by Paula Holmes, AIA, member of a pioneering generation of female architects who graduated from architecture programs in the 1940s. Many thanks to the owners for opening their homes, and to Suzie Fredregill and Meaghan Foshe of <u>lowa Mid-Century Modern</u> for their vision, coordination, and generous donation of proceeds to the Foundation.

ADVENTURES IN ARCHITECTURE

In 2023, the Adventures in Architecture youth community outreach program successfully reemerged after a pandemic pause. They year kicked off with first-time participation in I'll Make Me a World in Iowa Education Day, the largest African-American cultural event in Iowa. This event allowed volunteers to connect with Des Moines metro high school students and foster their interest in architectural design. Volunteers again turned out in June with a booth at the Des Moines Art Festival, enlisting passers-by in a community art mural of the State Capitol. IAF also proudly reintroduced a week-long day camp for middle schoolers on the campus of Drake University, expanding from half to full days. The camp offered hands-on workshops, field trips, and interactive sessions that introduced them to fundamental concepts of architecture, design and engineering.

"Architective" Scavenger Hunt Tours

In May, IAF volunteers led nearly 300 students on tours of downtown Des Moines as part of our Architecture in the Schools program. These interactive tours are a unique educational opportunity for grades 3rd and above, allowing students to not only experience urban architecture up close, but also to recognize different features and acquire new vocabulary for understanding the built environment. Our partner schools this year increased from 2 to 6, and the program launched new scratch-off scavenger hunt cards funded by the Iowa Arts Council.

IAF also hosted Central Academy high school exchange students from Japan. Guides led 30 visitors from downtown Des Moines to Western Gateway Park.









IAF Recognizes Krause Group, Des Moines Film, and Rialto Theater

The Iowa Architectural Foundation honored three recipients of its Community Enhancement Award: Krause Group, Des Moines Film, and the Rialto Theater (Pocahontas, Iowa). The statewide award recognizes those individuals, organizations, agencies, or communities, outside the architectural profession, across two categories of effective leadership, vision, and support for architecture. The "Architecture and Design" category, awarded to Krause Group, honors those who have repeatedly championed the cause of architecture or acted as a benefactor of architecture and urban design. The "Historic Vitalization" category, awarded to both Des Moines Film and Rialto Theater, celebrates leadership and achievement in the realm of historic preservation or adaptation.


A Chapter of The American Institute of Architects

An initial gift of \$50,000 provides a steady financial resource for the IAF's programs and events that inspire public appreciation for architecture and design. This support furthers AIA Iowa's mission of promoting the value of good design and advocating for the health and safety of the public.


The IMPACT Endowment was made possible by the extraordinary support for AIA lowa by its members and those allied to the profession of architecture over the past 115 years, as well as a culmination of efforts from volunteers and staff related to the programming and services that the Chapter provides.

As a 501 (c) (3) organization, we hope other donors will contribute to the endowment so IAF may continue to increase public understanding of this most public art. Individuals or businesses interested in making a gift to the endowment should contact the Community Foundation of Greater Des Moines, which is managing the sustainable endowment. All gifts will be eligible for the Endow Iowa Tax Credit. Annual distributions of 5% of the endowment will be made to IAF and distributed indefinitely.
